~ Weather permitting, the Liturgy of the Palms will be held outside in front of the church's entrance (around the circle).

THE LITURGY OF THE PALMS

BCP p. 270

When circumstances permit, the congregation may gather at a place apart from the church, so that all may go into the church in procession.

The branches of palm or of other trees or shrubs to be carried in the procession may be distributed to the people before the service, or after the prayer of blessing.

The following or some other suitable anthem is sung or said, the people standing

Celebrant: Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the

Lord.

People: Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Here a Deacon or other person appointed reads one of the following

A READING FROM: Mark 11:1-11a

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve. (NRSV)

On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our king, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The following or some other suitable anthem may then be sung or said

Celebrant: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Celebrant and People

(All baptized Christians are invited to receive the bread and wine. The ushers will dismiss by rows for communicants to form a line in the center aisle. We have two stations for distribution of the sacraments. Communicant's view is to your right or left.

Communion in "One Kind" (bread) is to be administered by the priest or deacon.

Station #1 - Common Chalice – Wine (left) Station #2 - Intinction (right)

Wine is offered by sipping from the cup (left) or intinction (right). If you would like to receive a blessing in place of communion, please come forward to the altar and cross your hands over your chest.

Station #1- At the altar, communion will be distributed in one kind (bread) by the priest/deacon. To receive the bread, hold out your hands; the priest/deacon will place the wafer in your hands for consumption. To drink from the cup, the Eucharistic Minister will follow with the cup of wine on your left.

Station #2 - To receive intinction (right), cup your hands in front of the priest; and the priest/deacon will dip the bread into the cup and place it back into the communicant's hand.)

CHANGES TO THE EUCARIST

We are going back to offering the communion cup! Communion will be offered in the form of bread and wine. To receive the **bread** only, open your hands, where the priest/deacon will place a wafer.

<u>Wine</u> is offered by sipping from the cup or intinction. After receiving and consuming the bread at the altar rail from the priest/deacon, you may drink directly from the chalice held by the chalice bearer (Eucharistic Minister).

For intinction, communicants may not "dip" the bread in the wine themselves. If you would prefer to have your bread dipped, simply cup your hand at the altar rail, and the priest/deacon will dip the bread for you. All servers, including the priest/deacon will be wearing gloves.

We would also like to remind the congregation that drinking the wine is not mandatory. The receiving of "one kind" (the bread) is a full and sufficient communion.
