LETTER FROM THE DEACON-IN-CHARGE THE REV. DARLENE A. JACKSON

Dear Church Family,

On May 15, 2021, I was ordained by the Right Reverend Susan Haynes, Bishop of the Diocese of Southern Virginia. My ordination service was small, only a few people were permitted to attend due to COVID-19.

My journey began on a Sunday morning when I found my way to 1242 W. Queen Street. This is where it all began, St. Cyprian's Episcopal Church. I was taught, I was nurtured, and I was loved. As I grew into my faith, I heard our Lord calling me to go further. That calling lead me to the Diaconate. I was called to the Order of Deacons and then after much study I was ordained. Initially, I hoped to be assigned to St. Cyprian's, but I was told that it is rare for a Deacon to be assigned to their home church. I see that God had other plans. I understand this is part of God's plan for me.

I am so thankful. I hope to provide a letter to my church family every month in the newsletter with thoughtprovoking and inspirational material (I hope). If anyone has any ideas for my letters, please feel free to let me know. Also, let me know when I fall short.

One of my responsibilities is Pastoral Care. I will be visiting people in their homes, hospitals or in my office at St. Cyprian's. I will also bring the Eucharist to parishioners when they are unable to come to church and I will never come uninvited. I may reach out with notes and telephone calls. Our church family will know that they are not forgotten.

I take Pastoral Care very seriously and Jesus' ministry was all about serving people wherever they are.

*What, Who and Why are there Deacons? By Deacon Darlene

Deacons are members of one of three distinct orders of ordained ministry. In the Episcopal Church, a deacon possesses "a special ministry of servanthood." A Deacon is under the authority of the bishop and serves all people and especially those in need.

In the ancient Greek-speaking world the term *diakonos* meant an intermediary who acted or spoke for a superior. Deacons proclaim the gospel, lead intercessions, wait at the Eucharistic table, and direct the order of the assembly, deacons function as sacred messengers, agents, and attendants. In the world today the Order of Deacons in the twentieth century has emphasized outreach and service. Bishops in the Episcopal Church expect their deacons to promote care of the needy outside the church. In addition to those ordained deacons as a permanent vocation, there are also "transitional deacons" who are ordained deacons as a step toward ordination as a priest. This practice is required by the canons of the Episcopal Church.

*People ask a lot of questions about Deacons and there is some confusion. Deacons seem to be a little mysterious. I plan to offer a 3-part series to inform curious church members. If someone has a question, please let me know.

Canon Timothy Dombek, spoke about stewardship and described many practices that a church can use to help people feel that they There was general approval of the belong. resolution to change the name of the event from Annual Council to Annual Convention, which will match the language currently used in most dioceses.

Altogether, the proceedings were uplifting; the fellowship was heartwarming; and the event, beyond its formalities, cultivated a friendly atmosphere for meaningful connections.


VESTRY TRAINING


NAACP REPRESENTATIVE

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross (or *The Way of the Cross*) is a prayerful devotion that recalls the series of events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and burial. In the early centuries of the Christian faith, pilgrims to Jerusalem often visited the places connected to the final hours of Jesus' earthly life. Over time, Christians unable to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem developed the practice of recalling those events using images and "stations" to imitate the Jerusalem pilgrimage and to meditate on the final hours and events of Jesus' life. There are fourteen traditional stations. Eight stations correspond to events found in the Bible, and the remaining six stations are either based on inferences from the Bible or on pious tradition.

St. Cyprian's will observe Good Friday Service on March 29, 2024 at 12 noon. During the service, parishioners will process together to each station as one person leads the readings. The readings will be assigned to volunteers in advance of the service on Good Friday.




REV. ERIC ROBINSON GUEST PREACHER FEBRUARY 4, 2024


